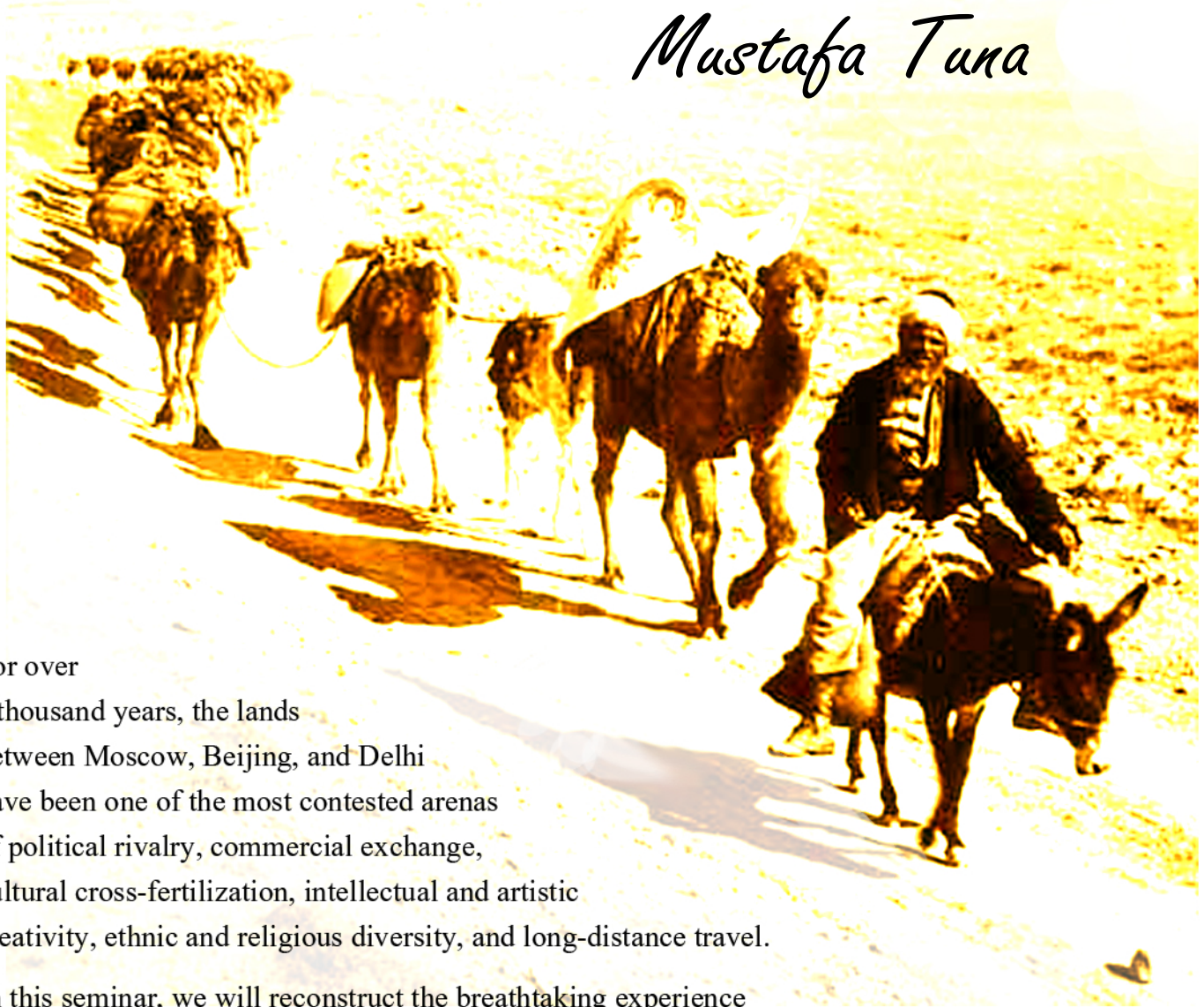


Between Moscow, Beijing, and Delhi

In this seminar, we will reconstruct the breathtaking experience of these lands between Europe and Asia through a critical reading of eyewitness narratives that range from the travels of a Taoist master summoned by Chingis Khan in the 1210s to the memoirs of a Chechen surgeon struggling to save lives under fire as the Russian government bombed Grozny in the 1990s.
